Theological Terms

Sanctification is the process of being conformed to the image of Jesus Christ through the work of the Holy Spirit. This process begins simultaneously at regeneration and continues throughout a Christian's life. Below are excerpts from this article to helps us understand more:

Definitive sanctification, which John Frame calls a "once-for-all event, simultaneous with effectual calling and regeneration that transfers us from the sphere of sin to the sphere of God's holiness" (Systematic Theology, 986)... Definitive sanctification entails the single act of God by which he sets the believer apart for his divine purpose... Definitive sanctification is an act of God's grace, not our effort, to which we contribute no virtue, but only receive by faith. (Romans 8:29-30)... Progressive sanctification is the practical development in our earthly lives of the definitive sanctification that God accomplished once-for-all. Progressive sanctification, unlike definitive sanctification, actually empowers the believer to respond with diligent, God-supplied effort. "Think of [progressive] sanctification as the outworking of the new life given in regeneration" (Frame, 987). (Philippians 2:12-13; Colossians 1:29)... The ultimate ordained means of redemption is the definitive sanctification that occurs simultaneously with regeneration and is accomplished solely by the atoning work of Jesus Christ, received by us through the instrument of faith alone. But the proximate means of redemption is the ordained response of the individual who responds in faith and then diligently makes faith-empowered war, in the strength God supplies, against sin and pursues conformity to Christ (Romans 8:12–13; 2 Corinthians 7:1; Ephesians 5:3-4; Philippians 2:12-13; Colossians 1:29; 1 Peter 1:13–16; and more).
